

The Association will host a biennial conference of the top scholars in the field, as well as a book prize. As part of the association, he will co-edit two book series with Oxford University Press and SUNY Press that will publish significant scholarship related to Political Theory.

Faculty and Students Awarded a Houston Endowment Grant

Research Series: Shana Gadarian

On September 23, Shana Gadarian presented her book Pandemic Politics in a Brown Bag talk, discussing the role of partisan elite messaging and emotion in public health crises. Her research explores how partisanship shaped public responses to COVID-19 and other health threats. Gadarian examined whether certain health threats can avoid becoming politicized and proposed future research on the limits of public health polarization.
