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### UH Transfer Rules

- Courses taken at AC must be completed with a C- or better.
- A maximum of 66 lower-level transfer credits can be used towards a UH bachelor's degree.
- A maximum of 2 credit hours in physical activity courses can transfer.

### Major Requirements

- **B.S. Math & Science:** complete 12 hours of approved mathematics courses & 8 hours of Life & Physical Sciences courses. Approved mathematics courses: BUSI 2305, all college-level MATH courses, or PSYC 2317.
- **CLASS Block:** complete 6 hours of CLASS coursework in two different fields outside of the major that does not overlap with other degree requirements. Approved subjects include COMM (or SPCH), ENGL (excluding 2311), FREN, GEOG, GOVT, HIST, PHIL, PSYC (excluding 2314), SOCI, or SPAN.
- **CLASS Diversity:** complete an approved diversity course (see UH catalog).
- **Minor:** complete a minor or approved substitute. No more than 6 hours of major coursework can be used towards the minor.
